

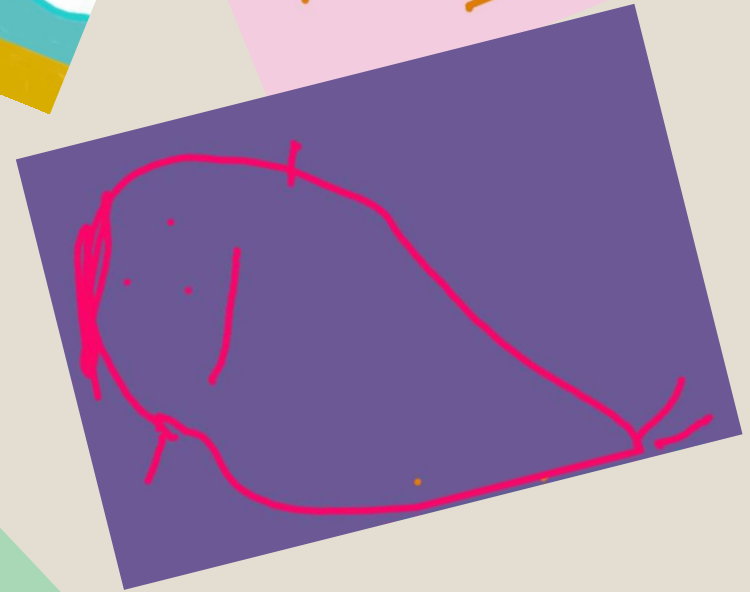
Computing at Abbey Mead

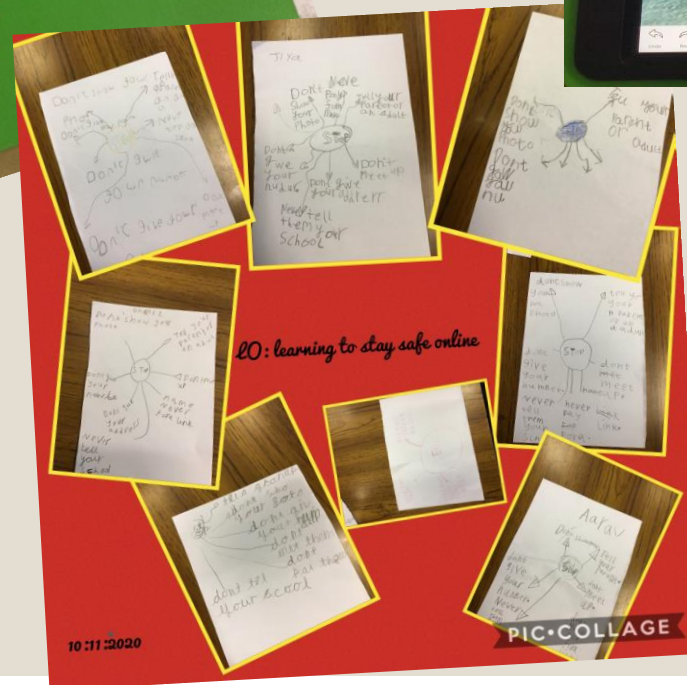
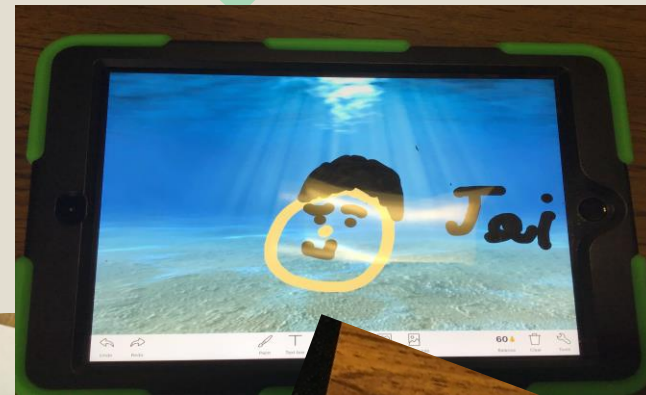
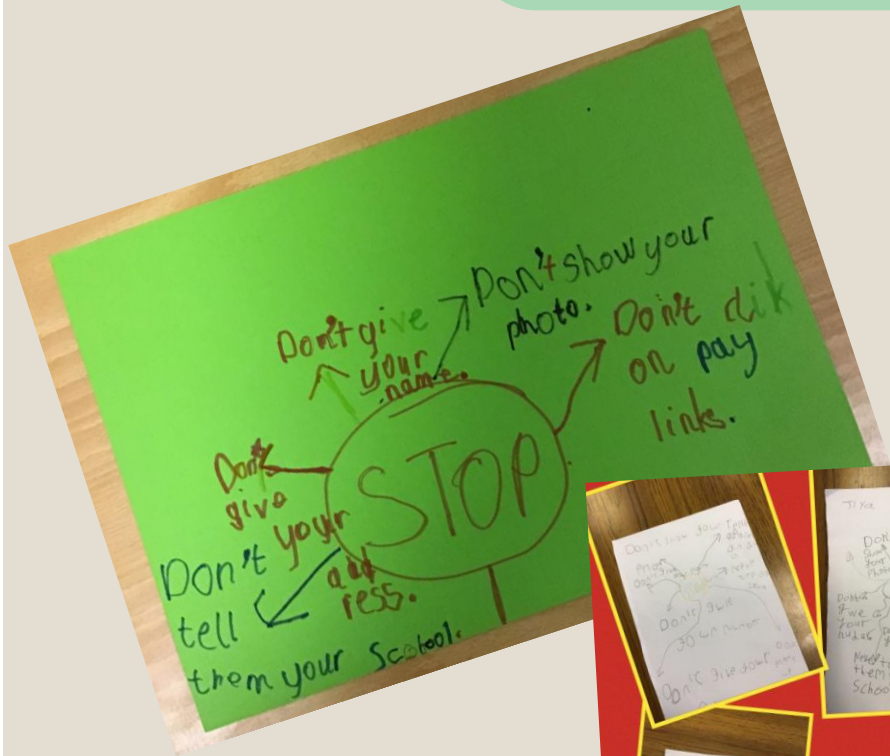

Year 1

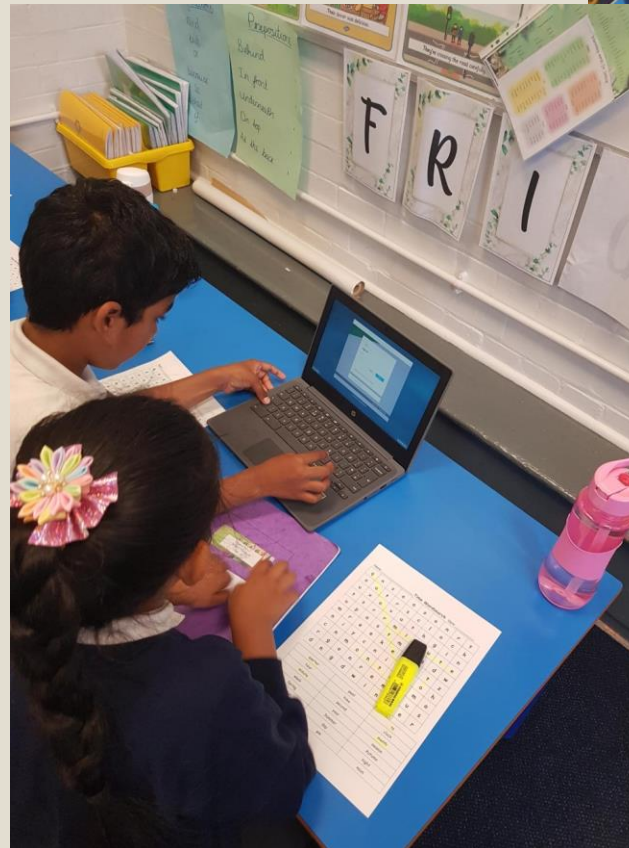
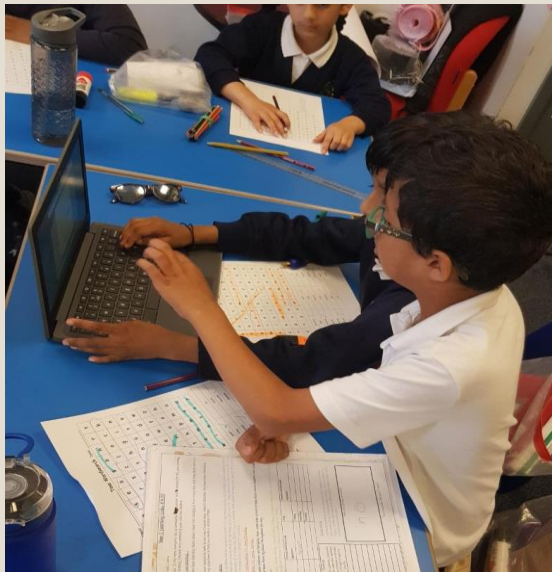
Digital Literacy

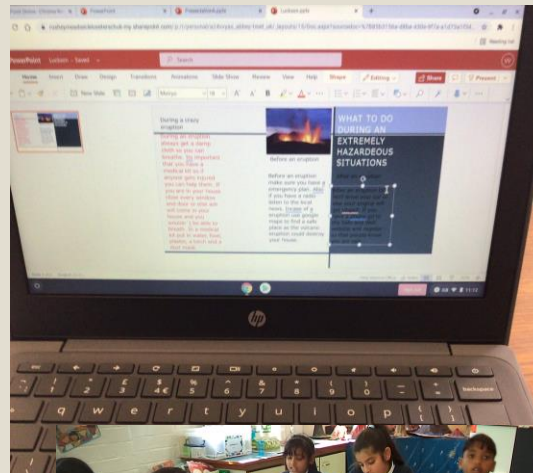
Year 2

Year 2 spent time learning basic computer skills such as how to turn on the chrome book, log in using their personal passwords and log out successfully at the end of the lesson.

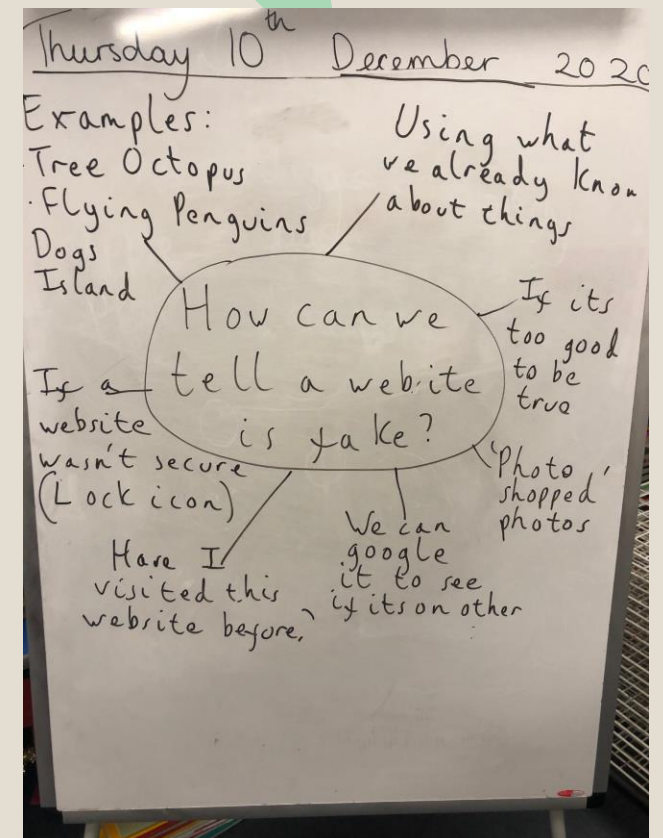


Year 3

The children used their knowledge and skills of computers to create an information leaflet. The children chose from a range of programmes to independently format and display their work.



Year 3 learnt that not everything you see on the internet is the truth. They explored different websites and came up with a criteria to decide if it was a fake website or not.



Year 4

Year 4 have been working hard on increasing their typing speed by learning how to touch type.

Year 4 explored the importance of age ratings and discussed the consequences to the physical and mental health of someone their age who plays an age 18 game.

Consequences chart

What might happen if Sam chooses to play the game?

Sam might feel scared as it's not his age and it might have violence and it think it's good.

What should Sam do? What should Sam say to Terry?

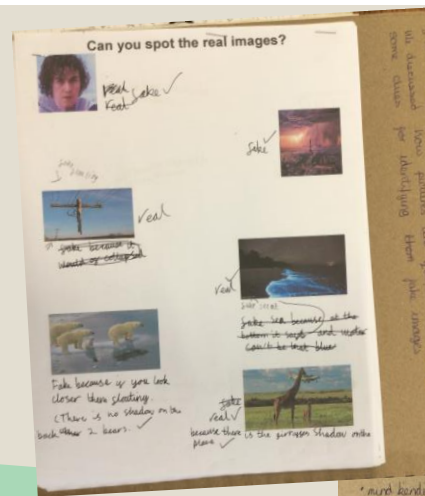
Sam might go to Terry's dad and tell Terry off. Sam might turn off the game and tell Terry not to play it.

Sam ~~not~~ should say "This is a 15+ game and we are only 7 years old, we should play a 7 year old game."

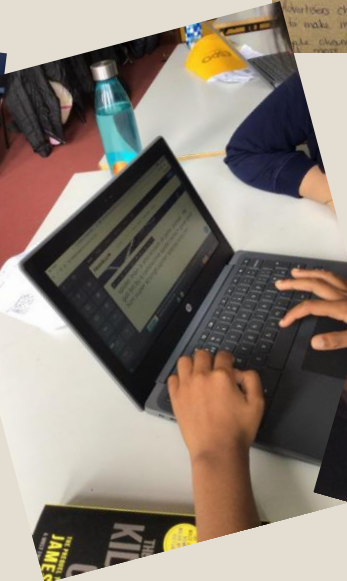
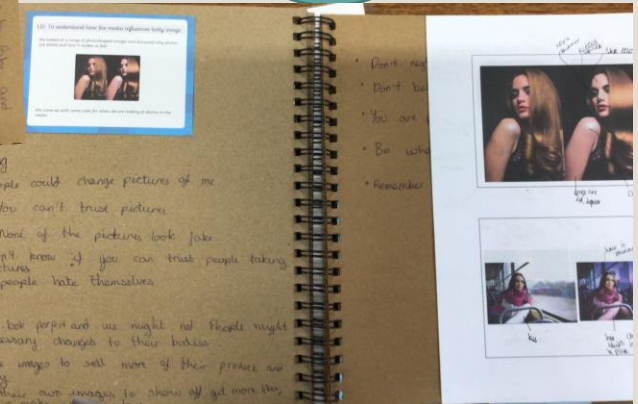
'I have really enjoyed learning to type as I can now write much faster on the computer. It was hard to start with as I kept wanting to look at the keyboard, but I find it much easier now.'

Year 6



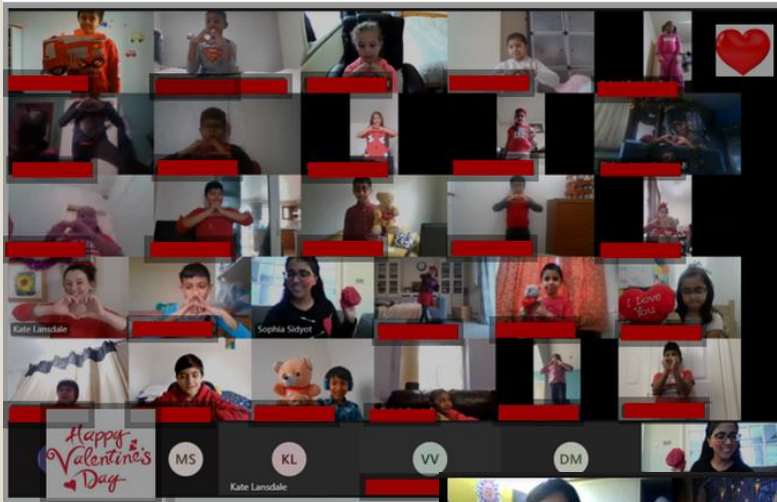

Year 6 learnt that some companies pay to have their pages show up first as adverts on results pages.

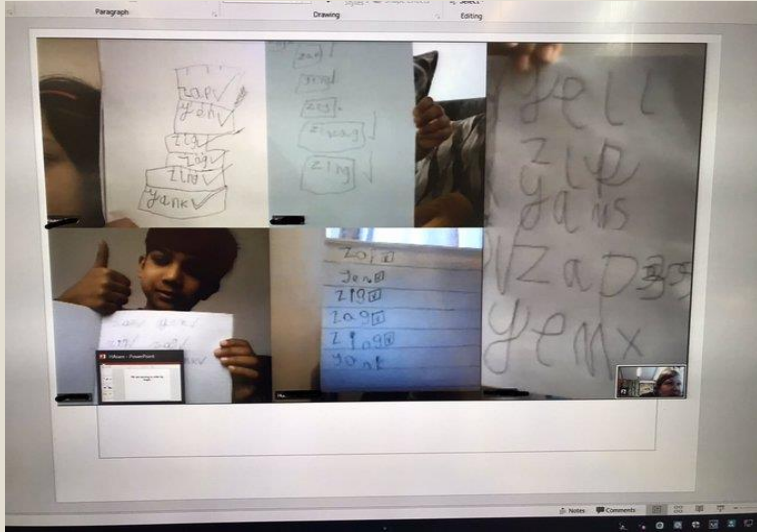


In order to make sure teaching could continue remotely if we went into lockdown or had to self-isolate all children and staff were taught to use Microsoft Teams.

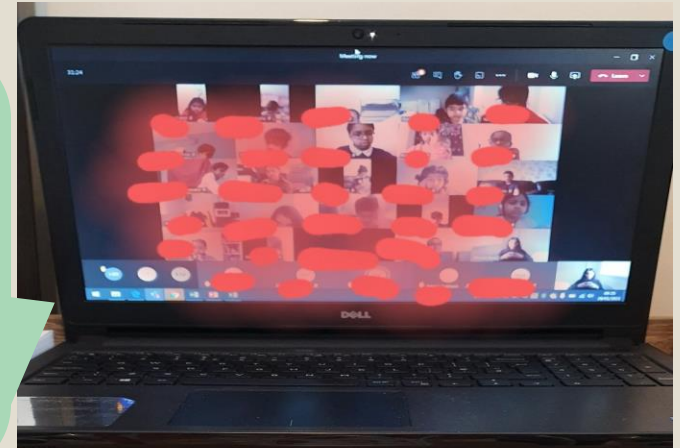
By using Microsoft Teams during lockdown, we were still able to celebrate important days together. Valentine's Day, Mental health awareness week and World book day



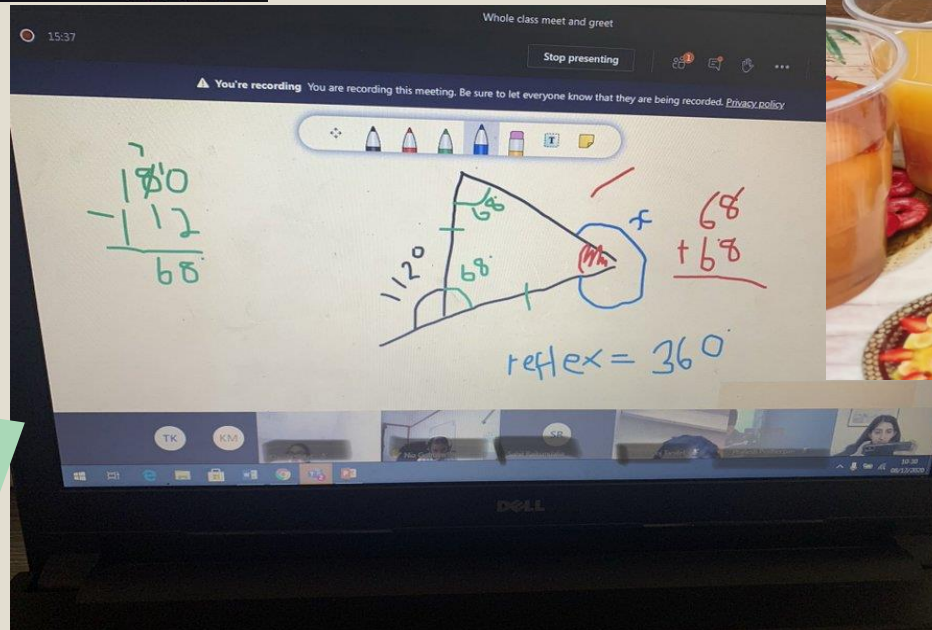
Using Microsoft Teams for home learning



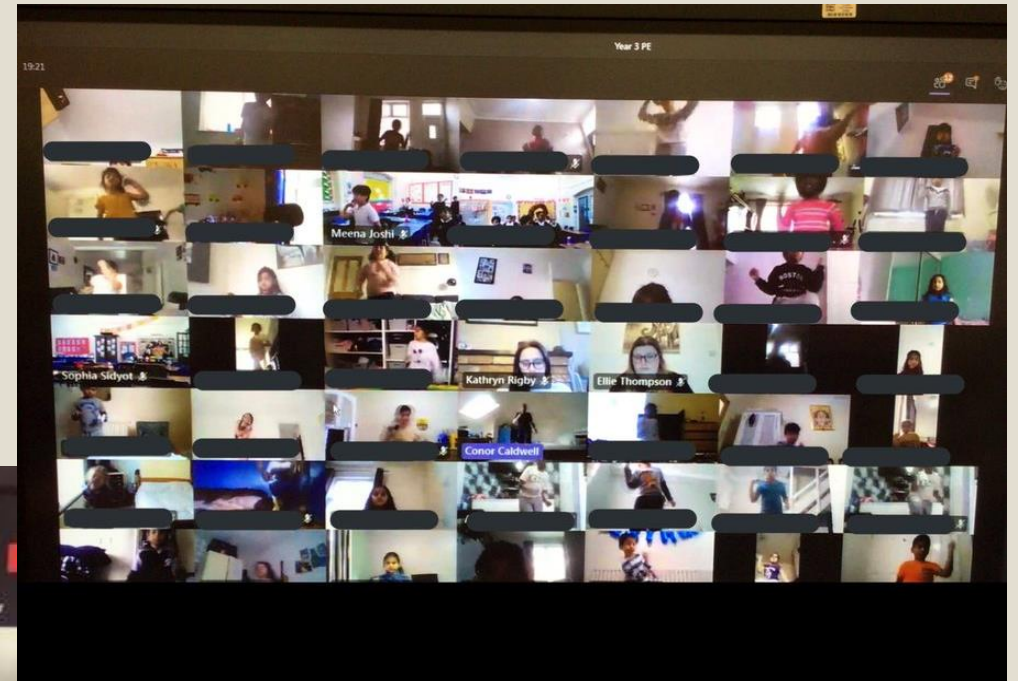
Year 4 even managed to complete a science experiment over teams.
