

#### **Handwriting**

#### <u>Aims</u>

- For all children to be able to write clearly and legibly and use their handwriting as an aid for spelling
- For all children to write fluently and at an acceptable speed
- For all work to be presented neatly and for pupils to have a positive attitude to handwriting
- For all children to feel proud of the presentation of their writing
- To enable children to develop their own joined handwriting style
- To teach the correct letter formation, modelling effective examples of handwriting at all times

Handwriting practice takes place up to four times a week discretely, reinforcing specific joins. The teacher will model the joins being taught to the whole class and may provide extra support for individuals as appropriate.

In order to help each child develop a fluent, legible style, children are taught to:

- Hold a pencil comfortably; promoting a legible style that reinforces writing from left to right, from the top to the bottom of the page and with a regularity of spacing between letters and words
- Develop a consistent size and shape for each letter
- Join letters correctly, developing greater control and consistency as they progress
- Consider their pencil grip and the amount of pressure that is transferred to the page
- Consider their body posture their chair should be tucked in, their body should be aligned with the table, they should be sat up straight and have both feet on the floor
- Ensure that they are in a comfortable position, considering whether they are left, or right handed
- To use line guides to help improve their presentation when writing in their books, or on paper

Technical vocabulary used and taught: Capital letters, ascenders, descenders, ligatures, cursive, flourish, exit stroke, mid-line, diagonal, horizontal, vertical,

#### **Progression**

Pupils are taught the following skills in this order, in order to consolidate on, or build cursive script where it has not been taught at Key Stage One:

- Sitting correctly at the table, holding a pencil comfortably and correctly
- Correct orientation, formation and proportion including formation of capital letters and digits
- Ensure that children understand which letters belong to which handwriting 'families' (that are formed in similar ways) and practise these.
- That presentation of writing is as important as content
- To form lower case letters that are the correct size relative to one another
- To start using diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters and understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left un-joined

#### **Intervention**

Some children or classes may require extra time practicing handwriting during the week, so those children may have a 15-20 minute handwriting lesson or intervention group to teach specific skills.

#### Initial mark marking is taught as follows;

#### Stage 1 Gross Motor Control

Developing physical strength in the arms is done through:

- Squeezing play dough in the hand
- Making large patterns in the sand
- Using large paintbrushes to paint water on the floor / walls outside
- Letter formation in the air
- Beginning to use scissors
- Pushing and pulling large toys with wheels
- Rolling hoops
- Twirling ribbons
- Hand painting
- Using construction toys
- Sliding objects around

#### Stage 2 Fine Motor Control

This is to develop flexibility and suppleness of the fingers and wrist, so that children can hold their pencil effectively and efficiently. Activities include:

- Finger painting
- Using a paintbrush
- Rolling a ball
- Tearing paper into shapes
- Cotton bud painting
- Using pegboards
- Cutting
- Sewing
- Threading


#### Understanding grip development



#### Palmer supinate grip



Most children start mark making by using the palm grip. The implement is held in the palm of the hand and the fingers curl around it to hold it in place. The movement is mainly controlled through the shoulder and wrist joints (gross motor) and children will typically make vertical, horizontal and round marks.




#### 2. Digital pronate grasp

The next grip is often the digital pronate grasp, although not all children use this. The mark making implement in controlled by one digit, usually the index finger, and held in place by the thumb. To use this grasp the child needs to pivot from the wrist to get to the paper. Movement is limited and mark making is similar to that of the palm grip.



#### 3. Static tripod grip

The next stage is often the static tripod grip which is usually favoured by boys. The pencil is pushed right to the end of the fingers. The movement is controlled by the little finger and clamped in place by the thumb although all the digits are in contact with the pencil. With this grip it is difficult for the child to see the marks they are making which hinders correct letter formation.



#### 4. Triangulation grip

The triangulation grip is where the pencil is held between the forefinger and the thumb and supported from behind by the middle finger. Ideally only these three digits control the movement of the pencil. The movement (fine motor) is controlled by the joints of the fingers and thumb and allows for maximum range of movement and flexibility. This is the grip to aim for. Handwriting in Reception (F2)

Handwriting in Reception (F2)

Handwriting is taught as part of the phonics lessons. Letter formation is taught alongside each new phonics sound that is introduced so it is more of an immersive approach.

All of the handwriting taught in Reception is in the print formation. See our script chart below to see the handwriting style we use:

# abcdefghi jklmnopqr stuvwxyz

The children have access to additional resources such as laminated print uppercase and lowercase handwriting sheets to practise on as part of their pre-register morning activity.

There is always the opportunity for the children to practise and develop their handwriting skills through the free writing activities in our continuous provision that are provided every day as part of each particular topic.

Children who need additional support with pencil control and general fine motor skill development are given intervention sessions such as 'funky fingers' and 'dough gym', helping to develop finger strength and coordination.

#### Handwriting in KS1

We use a cursive style which starts each letter on the line. Developing a cursive script helps children with spelling as it teaches combinations of letters which link together.

See our script chart below to see an example of the continuous cursive style we use:

We aim for children to develop a clear and fluent style by the end of Key Stage 2 and that they are able to adapt their handwriting for the following different purposes:

 $\cdot$  a neat legible hand for finished, presented work.

 $\cdot$  a faster script for notes.

· print for labelling maps or diagrams
