### **Online Safety**

## How to stay safe whilst shopping online

Many of us are spending more time than ever shopping online. It's worth doing some research on online retailers to check they're legitimate. Read feedback from people or organisations that you trust, such as consumer websites. Reputable organisations will have information on their website about how they handle your personal data (which should only be used to fulfil your order, and not shared with third parties).

Some of the emails or texts you receive about amazing offers may contain links to fake websites. If you're unsure, don't use the link, and either:

type a website address that you trust directly into the address bar search for it, and follow the search results

Use a credit card when shopping online, if you have one. Most major credit card providers protect online purchases, and are obliged to refund you in certain circumstances. Using a credit card (rather than a debit card) also means that if your payment details are stolen, your main bank account won't be directly affected. Debit card payments and purchases are not covered by section 75 of the Consumer Credit Act. But you might be able to make a claim for a refund under a voluntary scheme called 'chargeback'. When it's time to pay for your items, check there's a 'closed padlock' icon in the browser's address bar. It will look like this:

The padlock icon doesn't guarantee that the retailer itself is legitimate (and that their website is secure). It means that the *connection* is secure.

If the padlock icon is **not** there, or the browser says **not secure**, then **don't** use the site. Don't enter any personal or payment details, or create an account as they can easily be stolen from unsecure sites.

#### **Operation Encompass**

Our school is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces.

Operation Encompass means that the police will share information with our school about all police attended Domestic Abuse incidents which involve any of our children PRIOR to the start of the next school day.

As a school we have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.
