Traffic Update

Further to recent discussions with parents and residents around parking concerns, we have sought the ongoing support of the Leicestershire Police.

Our primary concern is the safety of our pupils and community so have asked for further support with this.

Traffic Enforcement Officers and the Police will work alongside the school to continue to promote our children's safety.

We remind parents to please be mindful of:



- Parking safely, ensuring they are not obstructing visibility and pedestrian pathways.
- Parking respectfully so as not to block access to residents' properties; especially by avoiding stopping or parking in the middle of road on Ellis Avenue.
- Crossing in appropriate positions, avoiding crossing immediately between parked cars where vision is obstructed.
- Following the advice of our crossing patrol officer on Ross Walk and the advice of staff that are present on each gate to keep our pupils and families safe.

We appreciate your ongoing support with this matter.

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Holidays in Term Time

We are looking forward to a positive year ahead of good attendance here at Abbey Mead. Regular attendance at school supports children in both their learning and character development. Children must attend school each day to make the most of their educational experiences.

Sadly, holidays during term time continue to impact the learning and progress of a number of pupils. As per our policy, holidays will continue to be declined. We ask that all absence is reported to the school office each morning so to ensure children are safe and their location is known. Where the school have concerns regarding a pupil's absence, home visits are carried out to ensure that children are safe and present at the home address.

Holidays abroad

We remind parents that any holidays should be arranged and taken outside of school time. There are 13 weeks of holiday a year where parents can travel abroad. We must put our children's education first!

Any absence during term time is highly likely to receive a fixed penalty notice. The penalty notice will be issued at the cost of £120 per parent per child, and if this is not paid within the allocated time frame your case will be referred by the Local Authority directly to the Magistrates' court.

Following a number of families across the city taking extended leave during term time, there has been a change to the ruling.

The changes in ruling, now states:

If your child has an absence of more than 20 days, the Local Authority has advised that a Penalty Notice is unlikely to be issued and the matter is likely to proceed to the Magistrates' Court for prosecution action instead. The Local Authority has advised that where a parent is found guilty, or where the case is proven against the parent, that this is likely to result in a fine (up to £2500) and the parent receiving a criminal record. This is because parents have a legal duty to ensure their child attends school where they are on roll regularly.

Whilst we do not wish for any parent to be taken to court, we must ensure that our pupils attend school regularly so to gain the best quality education possible.
