


Drop off and collection arrangements

Our crossing patrol is present daily on Ross Walk to further support children and families in crossing the road safely.






Ganesh Chaturthi

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Flu Vaccines—Thursday 3rd October

Annual seasonal flu vaccination is now due. All children from Reception (F2) to year 11 are being offered a free flu vaccination in school, as part of the national vaccination programme. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and make some people seriously ill. The flu vaccination is safe and effective. It helps to protect against seasonal flu and serious related complications, such as bronchitis, ear infections and pneumonia. It will also help to prevent the spread of flu and protect others who are vulnerable.

We will only give primary school aged children the flu vaccination if we have your consent. Please do this as soon as possible, using the instructions below.

How to give consent for your child to get the flu vaccination

 Make a note of the code for your school. For Abbey Mead Primary Academy the school code is LE147148 and visit www.leicsandrutlandimms.co.uk or scan the QR code using your smartphone camera to go straight to the website.



- Select Seasonal Flu, enter the school code and fill out the form. On the consent declaration page, you can consent for the nasal flu vaccine or the injectable flu vaccine.
- You will receive a confirmation email when the form is submitted.

Ofcom in their 'Children and Parents: media use and attitudes report 2019' found that children are more engaged online than they've ever been. 
