# **Online Safety**

# Cyberbullying

This is when someone uses the internet to bully someone else. The Cambridge dictionary defines cyberbullying as 'Someone who uses the internet to harm or frighten another person, especially by sending them unpleasant messages.'

# Best practices for parents and carers:

**Have an open conversation** – Listen and offer support and encouragement. If your child is a victim of cyberbullying, remind them that it is not their fault and that they do not deserve to be treated that way.

**Don't reply** - Most of the time the person doing the bullying is looking for a reaction when they are being mean online. Tell your child not to reply, instead they should tell a trusted adult what has happened. Instead save the evidence. This can be done by taking a screenshot of what has happened or by keeping the messages that your child has received.

**Don't deny access to technology** - Although it can be very tempting to remove a device from a young person if they are being bullied, having their device taken away may prevent them from speaking to you about worrying issues in the future.

If your child is a victim of cyberbullying, please do inform us so that we can support them in school.
