Nut Free School

As you have seen in the media, the Food Standards Agency has issued a widespread warning regarding the potential peanut contamination of mustard products. This has resulted in a change in the school menu for children with special diets. If your child has any allergies or special requirements, please make sure that school staff are aware of this.

Abbey Mead is strictly a nut free school and many of our pupils are strict vegetarians who do not consume any egg products.

We ask that parents are considerate of the above when sending any treats, birthday cakes or rewards for children in the school. Parents are welcome to bring in birthday cakes for children but if you are bringing a cake that contains eggs, please bear in mind that some children may not be able to consume this so we ask that you provide a suitable alternative for these children.

Ideally, we would prefer that you bring in eggless cake but we understand that this may not always be possible. **When purchasing anything for children, please check the packaging carefully to ensure that the product does NOT contain any nuts and is preferably egg free.**

Online Safety

Online Videos:

Online videos can be pre-recorded (like YouTube) or 'livestreamed' in real time (using apps like Twitch, or social media platforms like Instagram and Facebook).

YouTube is the biggest and most widely used video service. Over 400 hours of video are uploaded to YouTube every minute, so there is lots of great content that children can view. Of course, there is also inappropriate content, and parents have a couple of options to control what children can watch.

YouTube Kids is an app-based approach, available for both Android and Apple iOS devices. Aimed at younger users, it uses a mix of Google filters (who own YouTube), reviews by moderation teams, and feedback from parents to make sure that the videos available are suitable for those under 18.

For older children, or those who use a wider range of devices, **YouTube Restricted Mode** is an additional setting which can be enabled on the YouTube website and app. If enabled, it restricts the availability of potentially mature or inappropriate content.
