Creating a Sensory Room at Abbey Mead School

We believe in nurturing every child to achieve their full potential. Today, we're reaching out to our community with a dream: to create a sensory room that will transform the lives of our children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

For many of our children with SEND, the usual classroom environment can be overwhelming. The sensory room will be a haven where our special children can thrive and feel at home. We want to create a cozy space filled with soft lights, soothing sounds, and various textures. It will be a place where children can rest gently or explore fascinating tactile experiences. We see a space where breakthroughs happen daily, and every Abbey Mead child feels valued.

A sensory room at Abbey Mead would be an amazing addition where: -

Children who struggle to focus can find calm and clarity - Those overwhelmed by the busy school day can feel safe and in control - Children who find it hard to express themselves can communicate through touch, sight, and sound .

Every Abbey Mead child knows they belong. This room will be:

- * A respite for families who often struggle to find suitable environments for their children
- * A stepping stone towards greater independence and confidence for our children

SEND Information—Autism

We have many children across the school who have autism and it's important to understand their needs and how they may act differently to other children.

What is Autism?

Autism affects how people interact with others, communicate, learn, and behave. It does not mean that these children will never achieve the same as other children, it simply means they learn and react in a different way, so we need to accommodate for this.

Autism is a spectrum and everybody with autism is different.

Autism is NOT:

Bad parenting illness Linked to diet Something that will spread to others

Why may autistic children react differently to others in some situations?

- Some children with autism struggle to express their worries and concerns verbally so you may see them fidgeting or pulling an adult's hand to gain attention and show distress.
- Some children find social situations very over whelming.
- Some children do not like unfamiliar events.
- Some children take longer to process and understand information.
