CONTEXT

- The school joined TMET in September 2019
- 724 pupils on roll
- The demographic of the school has evolved over the past few years though the majority of pupils are still of Indian heritage
- > 97% of pupils speak English as an Additional Language
- The proportion of pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities is broadly inline with National figures
- In the top 10% of most deprived areas of the country
- The most reported crimes locally are Domestic Abuse and anti-social behaviour
- 10.3% FSM (Figures are much lower than the socio-economic breakdown of the area but these figures are lower due to multigenerational and multiple occupancy housing)
- 3.6% mobility
- Attendance for 23/24 96.1% (Persistent Absentees 8.8%)
- SEND 13%





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- Our Removing Barriers to Learning Team meet every two weeks . Children's specific needs are discussed and give targeted support to children and families as needed.
- Our Family and learning support mentor has built relationships with local community partnerships including food banks and domestic abuse charities.
- We offer swimming kit to families who need financial support
- All new starters who are pupil premium or who we know are disadvantaged are offered a school jumper and a PE kit
- We work with external agencies to support children with mental health




