 * A stepping stone towards greater independence and confidence for our children

SEND Information

What does SEND mean?

Special educational needs and disability – A child or young person has special educational needs and disabilities if they have a learning difficulty and/or a disability that means they need special health and education support. This can look very different from one child to another.

What if my child has SEND?

- They may get extra support in class to ensure they are able to access the learning.
- They may have access to additional interventions to support with communication, memory, fine and gross motor skills etc.
- They may have an EHCP (educational health care plan) which will state the support they should be offered and give them targets to work towards.

How can I support my child if they have SEND?

- Speak to their class teacher to find the best ways to support them with learning at home.
- Remember that simply interacting and playing with your child at home is just as important as their school attainment.
- Speak to Mrs Burgess (SENDCO) for further support.

Whether your child has SEND or not, all children are different so treat them with kindness and respect.


The children in 1SH have enjoyed learning about number bonds this week. They loved using practical resources to find numbers within 10.
